Student Testimonials History	Overview and Course Goals: This 9 Honors ELA course will focus on the close reading, analytical writing, and language skills in accordance with the California State Common Core Standards and that will have immediate relevance for you across your current courses and that are most essential for their future work in high school, college, and careers. The texts we will be reading take center stage, where we will prepare for close, critical reading of a wide range of materials. This course trains you to observe the small details within a text in order to arrive at a deeper understanding of it as a whole. It also trains you as a writer to focus on crafting complex sentences as the foundation for writing in order to facilitate complex thinking and to communicate ideas clearly. You will become a student who will be ready to encounter the world with your increased awareness of language.



- ❧ When choosing AP/Honors, please consider **balancing** other responsibilities, involvements, and obligations.
- ❧ Students can request modification of course selection until **June 8th, 2018** (subject to space availability).
- ❧ Students needing assistance will be advised to **utilize the multiple supports** available on campus to ensure their success in AP/Honors classes (i.e. Knight Zone, AP Tutoring, Knights Write, etc.).
