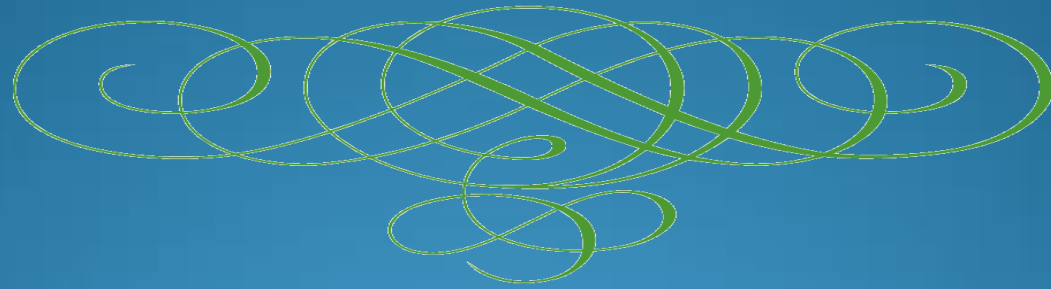

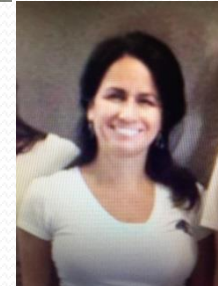

Course Selection

Things to Remember:

- ❖ You must enroll in a minimum of 4 classes
- ❖ University of California recommends a minimum of 5
- ❖ For Team Sports and TA's you must get a coach's or teacher's signature
- ❖ Please write **three** alternate electives on course selection sheet
- ❖ These courses are NOT guaranteed (even for seniors)!
 - ❖ 0 period classes and Ceramics/Sculpture

Things to Remember:

- If you repeat a course in which you previously earned a C, you will not get repeat credit
- If you repeat a course in which you previously earned a D, you must earn a C or better to get repeat credit
- If you take a foreign language at Palomar (Spanish 101, French 101 or ASL 100/101), it is strongly recommended you take the second level as well (102). **Palomar summer term starts on June 25.**

AP/Honors – Things to Consider

- These are year-long courses and you are making a commitment to completing both semesters.
- When choosing AP/Honors, please consider other responsibilities, involvements, and obligations.
- Students can request modification of course selection until June 8th, 2018 (subject to space availability)
- Students needing assistance will be advised to utilize the multiple supports available on campus to ensure their success in AP/Honors classes (i.e. Knight Zone, AP Tutoring, Knights Write, etc.)
- Once the school year has started, course changes to College Prep from AP/Honors are unlikely due to full classes

ASB is a student government leadership class, where students make decisions every day and are challenged to bring new, fun ideas to our campus, and help make everyone on campus feel involved too.

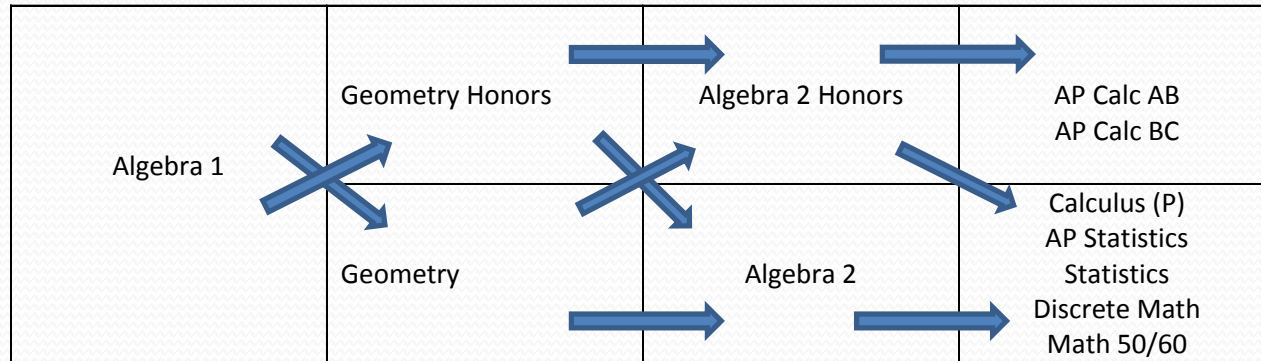

Philosophy: An introductory study of the nature of knowledge and how humans claim to understand that knowledge through the study of logic, reasoning, ethics, and reality.

Sociology: Sociology examines socialization processes, social interactions, institutions, inequality, and change. Key topics include race, gender, class, culture, and social change.

College Admission Testing

- We recommend you take both before the end of your junior year.
- SAT: www.collegeboard.org
 - March 10th, May 2th, June 2nd
 - Register at least five weeks before the test date
 - Cost - with essay - \$60 (always take with essay)
 - SAT Subjects- recommended for some majors and required by some universities. DO YOUR RESEARCH!!
- ACT: www.actstudent.org
 - February 10th, April 14th, June 9th
 - Cost - \$62.50 with writing section (always take with writing)
 - Fee waivers available in Counseling Office for students on free and reduced lunch
 - Check Knight Zone calendar for potential SAT test prep
