What is CCAP Dual Enrollment?

- CCAP = College & Career Access Pathway
- Agreement between Palomar College and SMUSD
- Offer Palomar College courses on your high school campus taught by Palomar College adjunct professors
- Facilitates HS students taking on college courses while they're still enrolled in high school

Benefits of Dual Enrollment

- FREE for students (you do not pay for books or tuition)
- Upon passing the class, you earn both high school AND college credit**
- You can earn weighted credit on your high school transcript**
- Courses transfer to 4 year colleges & universities (UC/CSU/Private)
- You attend class in the same format as a college class – so only 2 or 3 times per week

Course Descriptions

CS 101 United States History from a Chicano Perspective I (3 units)

3 hours lecture; Transfer acceptability: CSU; UC

A survey of early American history from the Mexican/Chicano perspective. Focus is on the period of discovery to Reconstruction with emphasis on the evolution, influence and experience of the Chicano. Chicano contributions are analyzed for political, social, economic and cultural development of the United States. Intended for students interested in history, ethnic studies or other social sciences.

COUN 110 College Success (3 units)

3 hours lecture; Transfer acceptability: CSU; UC

Provides students with the skills and knowledge necessary to reach their educational goals. Topics include academic learning strategies, college and life skills, diversity awareness and assessment of personal characteristics related to educational success. The role of race, ethnicity, gender, class, sexual orientation and age in higher education and personal identity is a central theme of the course.

Course Descriptions

LS 121 Introduction to Law (3)

An introduction to law and the legal system. Includes an examination of the federal and state court system, criminal law, civil law, administrative law, and procedural law.

Frequently Asked Questions

Is this different from the current system where I'm allowed to take courses at Palomar College?

YES. These courses are providing you an opportunity to earn first time credit high school graduation credit through Palomar College. They're also WEIGHTED, FREE, and offered on your campus

Can I take more than one CCAP course per semester?

No. You can only take one CCAP approved course per semester.

Can I take the US History course if I'm not a Junior?

Yes! You will earn elective credit towards high school graduation and well as a "g" credit for university entrance requirements.

What's the difference between taking an CCAP course and an AP course?

Both courses are weighted. With AP courses, you have to take the AP exam in order for colleges/universities to possibly give you college credit. With CCAP courses, if you pass the class, you automatically earn college credit that is transferable to community colleges and universities throughout the nation.

Steps to Enroll in a Course

1. Sign-in on one of the sheets up front
2. Take an enrollment packet.
 - a. Fill out the online application & get a Palomar ID number (skip if you already have one)
 - b. Fill out the Special Enrollment form AND agreement form, get it signed and initialed and turn it into your school counselor
 - c. Complete the online orientation
