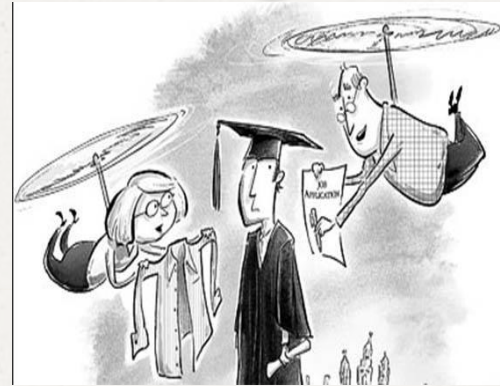

# Helpful Tips

- ★ Have your student take OWNERSHIP of the college application process but be their “guide on the side.”
- ★ Listen- be the asker of questions instead of provider of answers.
- ★ Even for the best time managers – this is an overwhelming endeavor. This process requires team effort.
- ★ Set aside time once/week to discuss student progress (don’t “nag” daily). Open, honest communication between you and your student is critical to the success of this process
- ★ This process begins the year of “letting go”... this is the beginning of their independence... they are the ones going off to college, work, military...

# Emerging Adult - Life Skills Key to College Success

**Key indicator** that your student is ready to begin this transition is the emergence of a **new level of personal responsibility**:

- Medical and Behavioral Health - manage sleep-wake cycles, procrastination, unmet medical needs.
- Academic Obligations - doing what they need to do to stay on track in school, mapping the connection between their current academic performance and future life plans.
- Shoulder Administrative Tasks - completing everyday tasks such as arranging a doctor appointment, mundane life task such as maintaining a calendar or meeting deadlines.

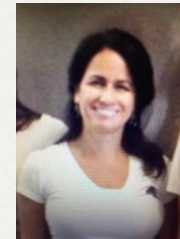

# Priority #1 = finding “good fits”

Academic Fit -grades, test scores, student’s success in a rigorous college prep program along with a college teaching style that meshes with the way student learns best

Personal Fit- social and cultural “needs” and “wants”

Financial Fit- family’s ability to contribute and family’s willingness to contribute

\*Keep in mind the most meaningful college ranking isn’t one you’ll find in a magazine article or book; ranking is based on qualities that make a college a good fit for **YOU!**



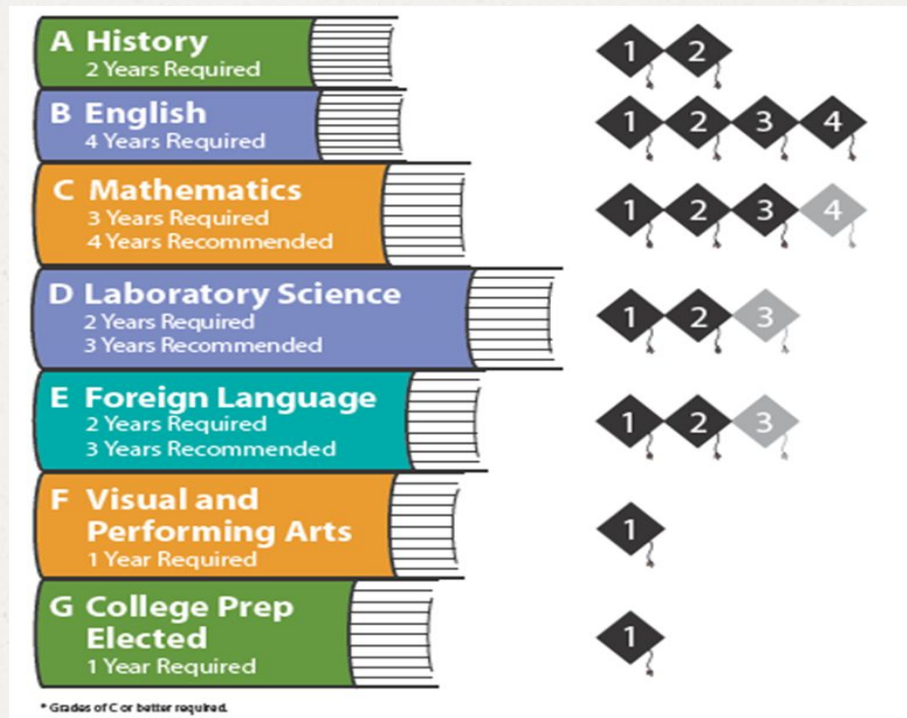

# University Requirements “A-G”



UC/CSU campuses consider a “D” grade in a required course a Subject Omission.

“D” grades need to be remediated. However there are exceptions. See Your Counselor!



# California State University (CSU) Admissions

- ❑ **APPLICATION DEADLINE: November 30**
- ❑ No letters of recommendation
- ❑ A-G coursework
- ❑ SAT/ACT scores
- ❑ GPA from A-G courses taken after 9th grade



# CSUSM Alliance - Guaranteed Admission (formerly PACE)

To be accepted at CSUSM as an Alliance student, students must:

- be continually enrolled in the District since the 9th grade
- complete all A-G coursework required by CSU admission policies
- meet minimum CSU eligibility index requirements
- participate in and successfully pass the CAASP in their junior year in mathematics and English, or successfully complete additional coursework designed to build the appropriate skills and knowledge
- take the SAT Reasoning or ACT Exam
- submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- ❑ No letters of recommendation/TBD\*
- ❑ \*Berkeley may request by invite only.
- ❑ A-G coursework/Weighted
- ❑ Quality of senior year coursework
- ❑ Personal Insight Questions **\*\*new\*\***
- ❑ SAT/w essay and/or ACT w/writing scores
- ❑ GPA from A-G courses taken after 9th grade
- ❑ Community service
- ❑ Extra-curricular activities, clubs, sports
- ❑ Leadership roles and awards received

# Community College

You can attend any community college in CA - Your local schools are Palomar and Mira Costa College.

- Undecided on academic or career goals
- Have not met requirements for admission to a 4-year college directly out of high school
- Second chance at first choice four-year institution
- Are not ready or able to leave home
- Want the affordability of community college (Two years free!)
- Want or need additional academic preparation or exploration in specific academic areas
- Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG): Several UC campuses offer guaranteed admission to California community college students who meet specific requirements.





# Palomar Promise

**FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED; SUBMIT EARLY: EVERYONE should apply (even if have plan to attend a 4-year university)** Application will be available in October. DON'T WAIT

- **Two** years free course enrollment and related registration fees, textbook assistance
- Access to specialized academic , career planning and support services to first-time college students who meet the eligibility requirements.
- Application will be considered complete and eligible for review based on the following:
  - a. Palomar College application submission date via CCCApply (OpenCCC)
  - b. FYE-Promise application submission date
  - c. Palomar College's receipt date of FAFSA/Dream Act application. *Errors made when submitting your financial aid application may impact your eligibility and result in delays in screening your FYE-Promise application.*
  - d. Enrollment in a minimum of 12 units for Fall 2020 by the required deadline.

# Private/Out of State Schools

- ❑ **APPLICATION DEADLINES VARY** - Check with each school, most will require:
  - ❑ Application, including one or more essays
  - ❑ 1-2 Letter(s) of Recommendation from teachers.
  - ❑ Official transcript
  - ❑ Secondary School Report
    - ❑ Includes a letter of recommendation from a counselor
  - ❑ SAT with Essay or ACT with writing, but requirements vary by college
- ❑ SAT Subject tests



# The Common Application

- ❑ Not accepted by the UC or CSU
- ❑ Currently over 600 member institutions
- ❑ Predominantly Private Institutions
- ❑ One application/school specific supplements
- ❑ **Deadlines vary**

In order to enable counselors/teachers to write the best possible recommendation for you, the following must be provided TWO WEEKS IN ADVANCE of the date the recommendation is to be mailed:

1. Counseling forms which the counseling office is to complete.
2. Student information form, completed by you.
3. Parent brag sheet.
4. An addressed and stamped manila envelope for each college to which a letter is being sent.

The student information form and parent brag sheet are attached to this form. It is your responsibility to provide the counseling office with forms from the college to which you are applying.

Counselors will not be able to complete the needed recommendation until after all the above are submitted to them.

# Testing Timeframe

- ❑ **SAT(w/essay)** and/or the **ACT(w/writing)** during the spring of their junior year and again during the fall of their senior year.
- ❑ Consider taking the **SAT** and **ACT** at least once to determine best score.
- ❑ Last testing date **no later than Dec.** of senior year, HOWEVER for some schools it is Oct/Nov (ie: SDSU).

**Check all dates, deadlines and school policies!**



# More on testing...

**More than 1,000 colleges are test optional...Not CSU/UC...yet! See Fairtest.org for more info.**

## **Some colleges require the SAT Subject Tests:**

- ❑ Math Level 1, Math Level 2, History, Social Studies, English Literature, Lab Science, Languages other than English.
- ❑ Can take up to three in a test administration.
- ❑ Optional for the UC system, but still highly recommended for some majors.
- ❑ Maybe required for competitive private schools.

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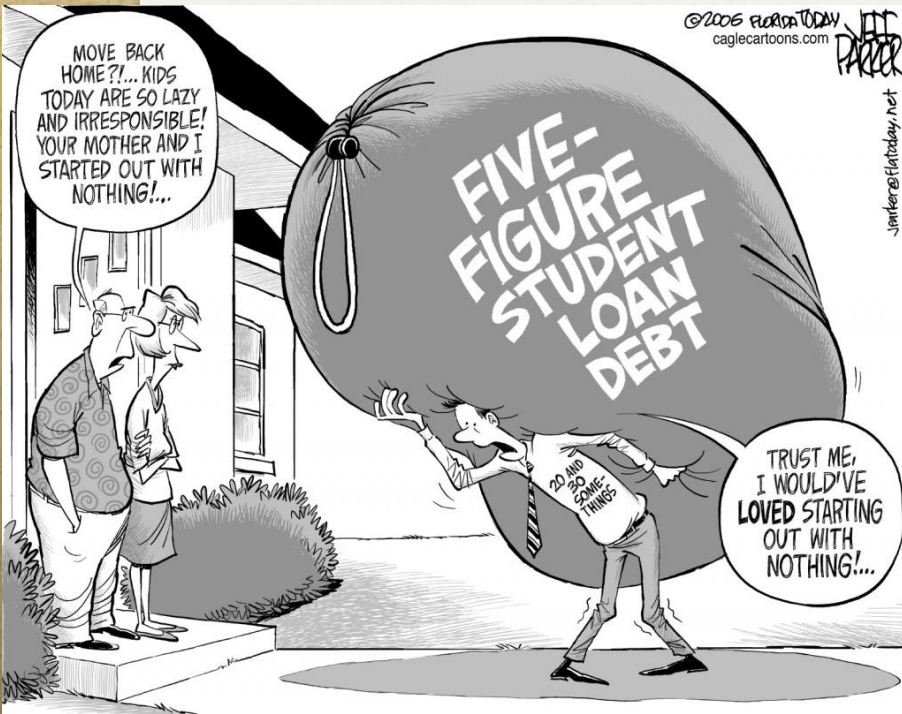

**CSS PROFILE:** Required by some private colleges as listed on [www.collegeboard.org](http://www.collegeboard.org).

- ★ **Apply:** Starting October 1st. Deadlines vary.
- ★ **Cost:** \$25 for first school; \$16 additional.
- ★ **Info Needed:** Taxes/earnings from current and prior year, investments, benefits received, checking & savings amount, mortgage/rent info, business info, etc.

**Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA):** Required by all colleges, universities, and technical programs. Visit [www.fafsa.gov](http://www.fafsa.gov).

**CA Dream Act:** Allows undocumented students who qualify for AB540 to apply for CA state and institutional aid. Visit [www.caldreamact.org](http://www.caldreamact.org).

- ★ **Apply:** Starting October 1st. Due March 2nd for state aid. Other deadlines may apply. Financial aid process is first come, first served!
- ★ **Cost:** Free!
- ★ **Info Needed:** SS# if applicable, taxes/earnings from 2016 investments, checking & savings amount, etc.
- ★ For FAFSA, use IRS Data Retrieval Tool to link taxes if possible!

## **FSA ID:**

- ★ Self-selected username and password that both students and parents must create
- ★ Visit [fsaid.ed.gov](http://fsaid.ed.gov) to create a username and password to be able to complete the FAFSA.
- ★ For CA Dream Act, visit [caldreamact.org](http://caldreamact.org) to create username and password

## **Student Aid Report:**

- ★ A summary of information you reported on your FAFSA or CA Dream Act; includes your family's Expected Family Contribution (EFC).
- ★ Available a few days after submitting FAFSA/Dream Act. *Review your SAR to ensure successful FAFSA/Dream Act completion!*
- ★ If necessary, add additional colleges or make corrections.

## **WebGrants for Students:**

- ★ To check your Cal Grant status, create an account at [webgrants4students.org](http://webgrants4students.org)
- ★ Cal Grants are need-based and require a minimum of a 2.0 GPA, with additional funds for students with a 3.0 or higher.
- ★ In June, use WebGrants to confirm your intended college and graduation status.

## **Verification:**

- ★ Colleges may require additional documents to confirm the information reported on your financial aid forms.
- ★ You may be asked to provide a tax return transcript, proof of citizenship, or documentation of legal guardianship (if applicable).
- ★ Request a tax transcript at [www.irs.gov/Individuals/Get-Transcript](http://www.irs.gov/Individuals/Get-Transcript).
- ★ Your financial aid will be pending until you submit all requested documents by each college's deadline.
- ★ **Complete verification ASAP!**

## **Financial Aid Award:**

- ★ Once you have completed all steps above, the college will provide you a financial aid award through your student portal.
- ★ The award will show the amount of financial aid you will receive if you attend that college.
- ★ Review all your financial aid awards with uAspire before submitting your intent to enroll by May 1st.

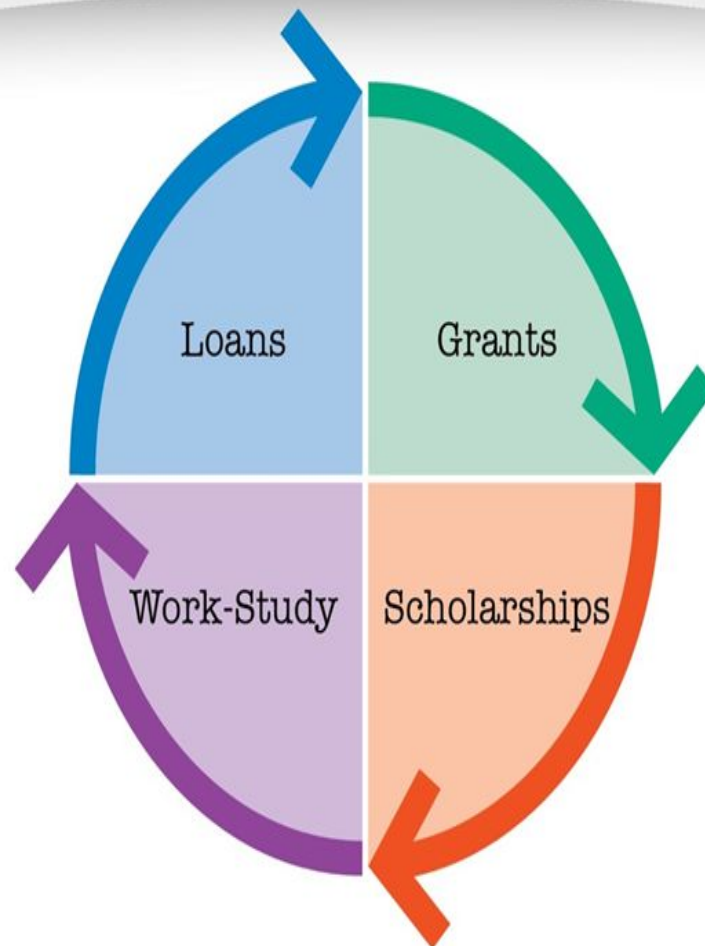
# FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

- Each year, the federal government awards need-based grants loans, and work-study
- Must file the FAFSA to be eligible for **federal aid**.
- Available **October 1**
- **Due by March 2nd** for CA public institutions.  
Some universities deadlines may be Jan/Feb.

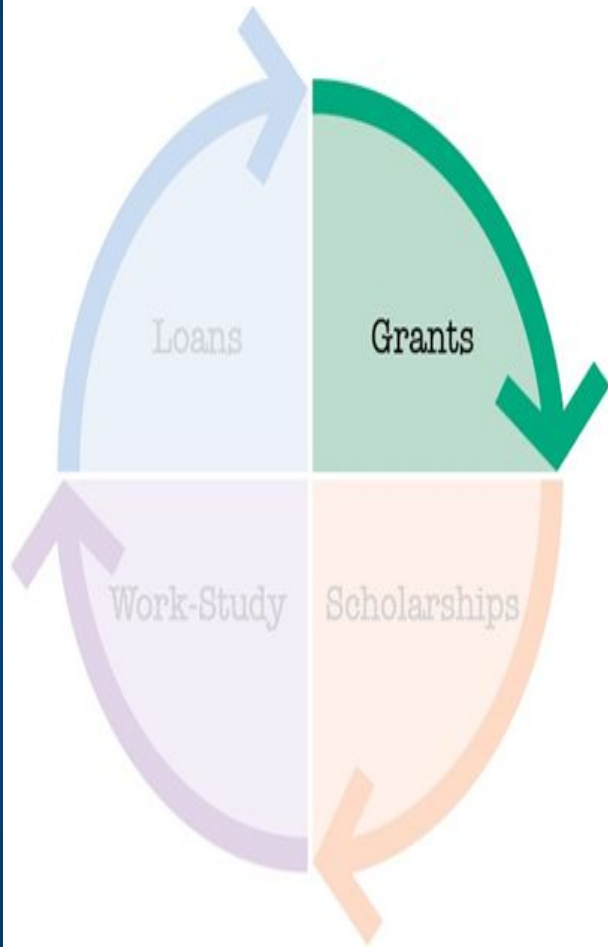

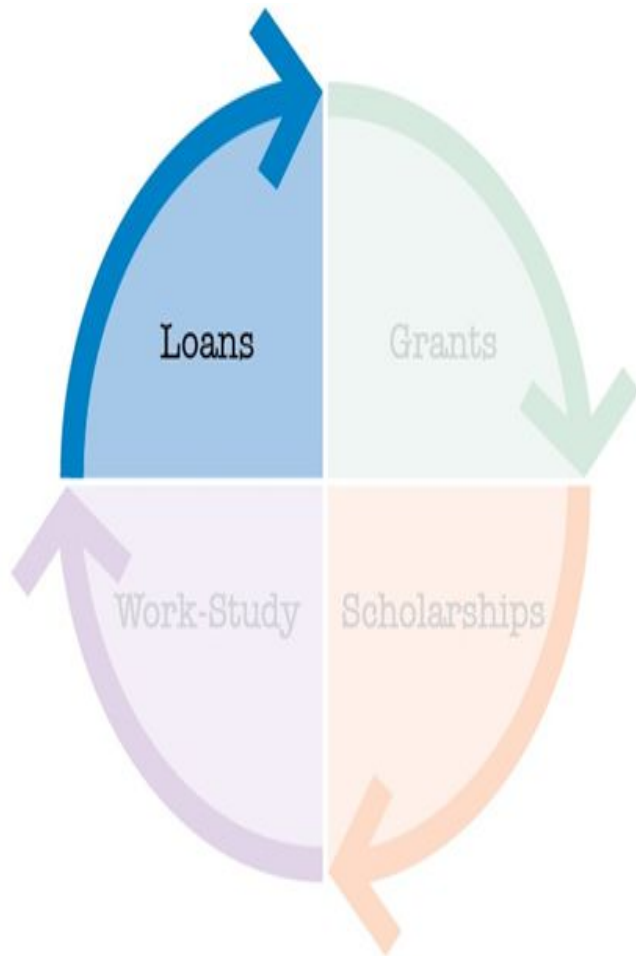
# WORK-STUDY



- Based on demonstrated need
- Student is provided an on-campus job
- 10 – 15 hours per week and paid directly to student
- Generally above minimum wage

- Private Loans

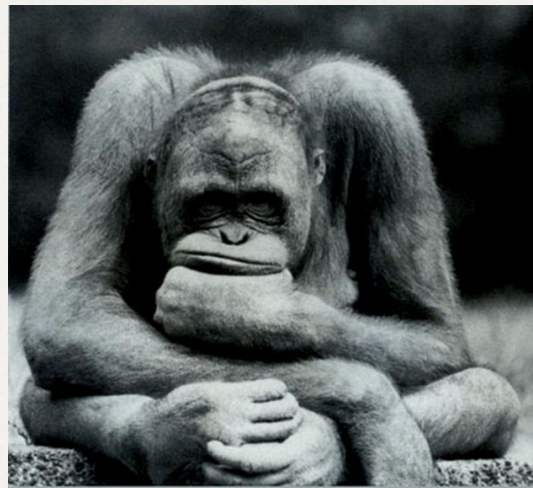
