

On Tuesday March 10th, students are invited to join us for a Day of Silence. The day is modeled after a GLSEN's event in which participants vow not to speak in order to spread awareness regarding the harmful effects of bullying, harassment, and silencing of people's voices and experiences. Clubs on campus and ASB designed stickers to represent their current culture or cultural heritage. Students can choose up to 2 stickers that represent their culture, heritage, or alliance. During the school day, as students represent these groups, your silence will be symbolic of the silencing many people face. Everyone is invited to participate, even if you are not a member of one of the cultural clubs, to show support for all. This is a day to be respectful and to remember we all are Knights, we all are facing a battle that we can help each other through. Stand in solidarity and show SMHS is a No Place for Hate School.



North County Lifeline's HERE Now program will be on campus March 2-14, 2020 per the Assembly Bill No. 2246 requirement in which each school must provide suicide prevention training. They will be presenting, for the 4th year, the SOS (Signs of Suicide) Prevention evidence-based program to our 9th graders during their science class. The focus is to decrease the rates of suicide by educating students on the risk factors of suicide and reducing stigma around seeking help for themselves or others. Students and parents can opt out of the program if they choose by completing the opt form that was provided on Tuesday, Feb 25th in their science class.
