San Diego Workforce Partnership (SDWP) https://workforce.org/

The San Diego Workforce Partnership (SDWP) funds job training programs; they are the local Workforce Development Board designated by the County of San Diego.

- SDWP provides targeted employment services designed to help our eligible graduating and adult students (Adult Transition program).
- SDWP's six career centers provide employment services, including career assessment, job training and job search assistance.
- SDWP also funds youth programs that provide work-readiness training to youth from low-income households as well as youth who are at risk of dropping out of school. SDWP also administers youth employment programs.

Funded programs include:

- Career centers: offering job search and career development resources regardless of income or background at no cost.
- CONNECT2Careers and CONNECT2Careers STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art and math): online portal filled with thousands of local job and internship opportunities. They also provide inperson training opportunities for building résumés, practicing elevator pitches, preparing for interviews and learning about the local labor market. When students sign up they get their own Peer Job Coach who they can call, text, or direct message for help on a job search.
- **Independent Living Skills**: Tier 1, ILS, provides case management and supportive services in the areas of housing, employment and education. Tier 2, provides workforce services, provides intensive work-readiness classes and workshops, career exploration and job shadowing experiences, internships and job placement services, and assistance with vocational and post-secondary preparation.
- RISE Up retail training: a 15-module training program and credential that prepares job seekers for
 positions in retail

SDWP Services for Out-Of School Youth

POPULATION SERVED: Youth ages 16–24 who are not currently enrolled in school, including high school dropouts, youth with disabilities, those involved in the justice system, homeless, runaways, foster youth, pregnant or parenting or requiring additional assistance to participate in education and employment.

PURPOSE: Workforce development for educational and employment services for out-of-school youth and young adults. Provide access and entry into post-secondary education and/or occupational/technical skills training and career pathways. These programs work in partnership with training institutions, community colleges and/or four-year colleges and universities that lead to post-secondary degrees and/or industry recognized certifications.

* NORTH COUNTY SERVICE PROVIDERS: Access, Inc.; Interfaith Community Services; YMCA San Diego (North).

These north county service providers are funded through the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act. Commencing this year, we will be partnering with these entities (including our existing partner - the North County Coastal Career Center) to facilitate introductions and access to their services. To ensure our students are aware of all north county services that may assist them in reaching their post-secondary goals, we are adding a field trip which will incorporate an introduction to all four sites and services. Details regarding these individual programs will be the subject of future *Programs in the Spotlight*.
