

Prevention not reaction

- Immediately report instances of bullying and/or harassment
- Conflict resolution
- THINK before you post

Earning Credits

- Every class that is passed with a D or better earns 5 credits.
 (C or better is required for UC/CSU a-g eligibility)
- Students typically earn 30 credits a semester or 60 a year. A total of 230 credits are needed to graduate
 - Credit Recovery: options during the day, before school and after school to retake a class online.

Counselors deliver classroom presentations in Fall and Spring teaching students how to read their transcript and understand what classes they need to graduate and/or attend college/university.


