In NEED Column:

- Should be 10 in English and Social Studies (talk to counselor if >10 credits)
- Make sure you select courses for senior year that align to the subject area credits still needed
- Total needed should be 60 or fewer.

Look at your own transcript

1. How many classes must you take senior year to graduate? Write it down on course selection worksheet.

*UC & selective universities recommend five (5) core courses senior year

- **40 or fewer** You must select a minimum of 4 courses (you may take 5-6 if you want)
- **45-50-** You must select at least 5 courses
- **55-60-** You must select at least 6 courses
- **65 or more** You must select at least 6 courses and consult with your counselor about credit recovery
- 2. Write down any classes you need to re-take to meet graduation requirements and/or A-G (D, F, and NP "No Pass").

You will discuss this with your counselor during the course selection meeting.

Please remember when choosing:

- Seniors must be enrolled in a minimum of 4 courses per semester (even if you're ahead in credits)
- PLEASE include alternate electives that you would want
 - o There are popular courses that fill, even for seniors!
- o period is **NOT** guaranteed
- TA positions are limited to 10 credits (over all four years).
- Choose balance and don't overload yourself. Think of obligations outside of school.
- Minimum graduation requirements must be taken on the SMHS campus (ex: English 12, Government).
 - For classes taken off campus, (charter, Palomar College, etc. are applied as *elective* credits) please contact your school counselor for further information.
- Students are limited to 6 classes per day (unless enrolled in band or AFJROTC)

Begin choosing classes



- Refer to worksheet- write in each required subject area and course requests as the counselor goes through each slide, you will also begin to enter in course requests on StudentVUE
- Consider A-G and graduation requirements
- Do not forget about BALANCE
- Pick elective alternates as many courses will fill...even for seniors!
- Discuss your choices and rationale with parent/guardian at home.

Career Technical Education (CTE) & Other Electives

- If interested in a Level 1 CTE, may only request one.
