1. Describe the item(s) requested and the rationale for this request.

Math department is requesting "Wipe Boards," which are affordable white boards to be placed around classrooms. Our teachers are engaging in new instructional practices, overhauling how our students engage with mathematics. According to several math ed publications having students standing and working on boards in groups encourages collaboration and engagement. Our teachers will be doing a book study of one such publication, *Building Thinking Classrooms*. Ensure each classroom has enough white boards, will allow our team to explore new techniques when engaging students and apply what we learn from our book study.

13 units @ \$51.99/unit = \$675.87 + \$41.71 shipping

3. Have you sought other funding sources? If so, what were those sources?

Math department funds are very low. PTO has already helped us to supply all classrooms with calculators.

4. Which LCAP goal(s) does this request address?

Goal I: This new approach to engage with mathematics will provide students with equitable access to engaging mathematics aligned with Common Core.

Goal II: Having students up on walls encourages collaboration and accountability there for acting as an effective intervention to maintain student thinking and effort.

Goal III: In conjunction with our department wide planned book study of *Building Thinking Classrooms*, teachers will be able to apply our learnings in the classroom. This will enrich our exploration into better ways of engaging our students and strengthen our efforts in professional growth. By having enough boards for every classroom we can encourage all teachers to participate in improving the way we have our students engage in our math classrooms.

5. How many current year students will this benefit?

All Students enrolled in a math course.

6. How will this benefit students?

Many studies have shown that standing while working increases thinking levels. Having student work on the board allows students access to other methods and strategies and encourages students to learn from each other leading to more peer to peer collaboration. I have witnessed this effect first hand in my own classroom.


